## Asian Waterbird Conservation Fund

**Public awareness campaign to enhance the conservation of migratory shorebird and their habitat at Chao Mai Marine National Park, Trang Province, Southern Thailand**

### Project Summary : June 2006

A public awareness campaign will be carried by Wetland International – Thailand Office to promote the sustainable management and wise use of wetlands to address local poverty and biodiversity management needs. The project site, Trang River Estuary, is a Ramsar site supporting over ten thousands migratory shorebirds every year and a number of endangered or threatened species such as Black-necked Stork *Ephippiorhynchus asiaticus*, Greater-crested Tern *Sterna bergii*, Chinese-crested Tern *Sterna bernsteini* and Asian Dowitcher *Limnodromus semipalmatus*. A workshop will be organised to enhance communication and cooperation among local communities, local administration, local government officials, school teachers, children and Park staff. Posters and brochures will be produced and distributed to public to promote awareness. The whole project will last for 3 months.
